Indian Creek—Caldwell, Idaho

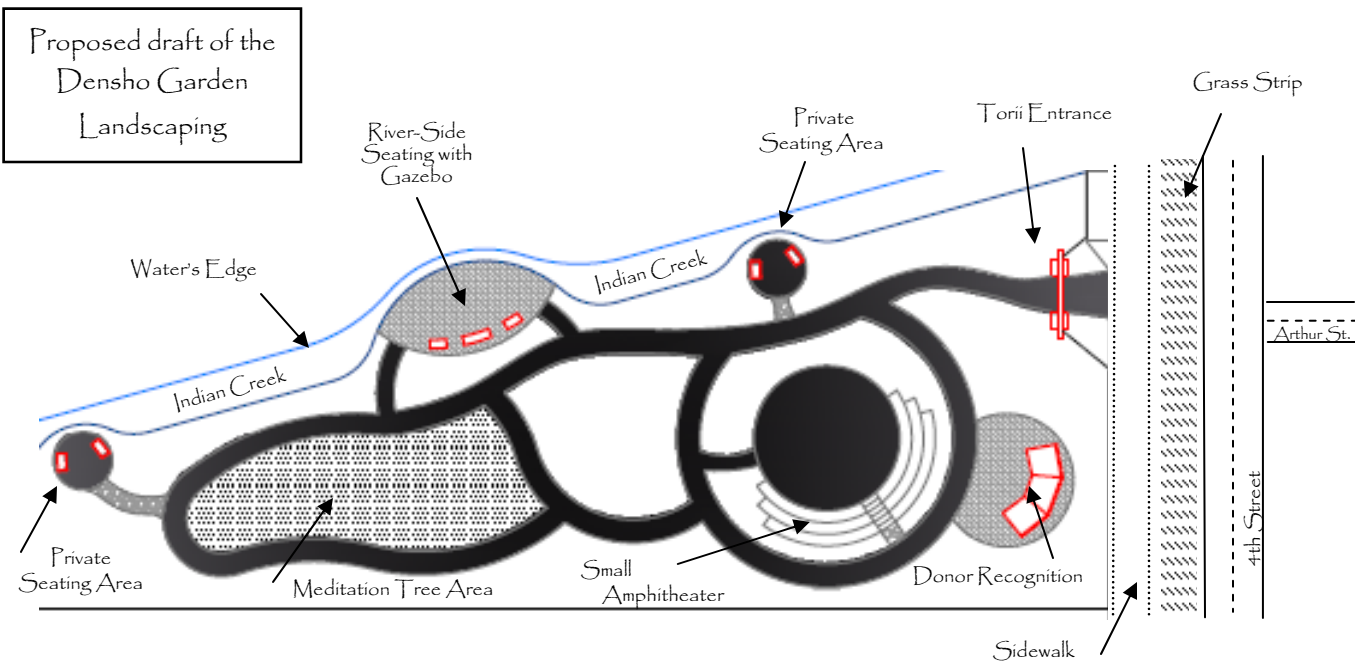
Densho: A Japanese term meaning "to pass on to the next generation," or to leave a legacy.

History: After hearing that the City of Caldwell was open to participating with local organizations to help improve and support the Indian Creek Project, members of the community and the Boise Valley Japanese American Citizens League approached the Caldwell City Council to discuss a possible collaboration.

We learned that there is a triangular shaped site owned by the City on 4th Street and Arthur Street that is adjacent to the creek and was identified for a small park. With enthusiasm, we knew that we wanted to partner with the City to develop this site and add to their vision of this area. In January of 2009, Caldwell City Council and Mayor Nancolas approved our partnership.

Our Vision: We are proposing a park that will emulate a Japanese garden with walking paths, benches and beautiful landscaping. We feel strongly that this "Densho Garden" should be a "legacy park" honoring all of the ancestors who settled in this valley and made contributions to our community. This park will be a place where the entire community can relax, stroll, meditate, contemplate, educate, and even have special gatherings.
